Matthew 28:1-10 Easter Sunday

Happy Easter!

Even in the midst of a global pandemic.

When so many people have suffered
darkness, loneliness, anxiety, hardship...

We can still say Happy Easter!

Why, well because Easter is the ultimate
expression of Hope.

Easter says that darkness, loneliness,
anxiety, sadness, fear, hate doesn't last
forever.

On Good Friday the followers of Jesus had
seen Him crucified on a cross.

Their hopes had seemingly been dashed.

All they could see was defeat, with no hope
for the future.

Then on the first Easter Day we hear that
some women arrived at the tomb to anoint
Jesus' dead body.

They found the tomb was empty.

An angel told them that Jesus had Risen.

It says, "So the women hurried away from
the tomb, afraid yet filled with joy."

Their sadness turned to joy.

On the evening of that first Easter day, the
other disciples were gathered together in a
room, with the doors locked, and it says, for
fear of the Jews.

Then the risen Jesus appeared to them and
said, "Peace be with you."

He imparted peace to their frightened hearts.

Their fear turned to peace.

A while later, the apostle Paul, who at first
hated the early Christians.

He spent his time persecuting them, having
them thrown into prison because they were
claiming that Jesus had risen.

Then the risen Jesus appeared to him on the
road to Damascus.

His life was transformed...

His hate turned to love.

20 years later he wrote.. "the Son of God
who loved me and gave himself for me."

Easter turns our sadness into joy.

Our fears into peace.

And our hate into love.

And it says these things don't last forever...

Over this past year over 126,000 people
have died from coronavirus in the UK.

That is a lot of people.

That is a lot of sadness and grieving, which
is important to do, we should grieve our
losses.

Many people have the question, "What
happens when I die?"

Its an important question...

Headline in satirical magazine.

World death rate holding steady at 100%

It affects us all...

When you go to the funeral and the coffin
goes into the ground.
It looks final.

And it is unless death has been conquered.

Easter says we can have hope even in the
face of death.

Jesus dead body was raised to life.

He had a resurrected body, he ate fish!

*"Brothers and sisters, we do not want you to
be ignorant about those who fall asleep, or to
grieve like the rest ...who have no hope. For
we believe that Jesus died and rose again,
and so we believe that God will bring with
Jesus those who have fallen asleep in Him.
The dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we
who are still alive and are left will be caught
up together with them... to meet the Lord in
the air. And so we will be with the Lord
forever, therefore encourage one another
with these words" 1 Thess 4:13-18*

Death is not the end, God will raise us to
new life.

To live with him eternally.

That is eternal life. That is the gift that Jesus offers.

Your future is secure.

Easter is the ultimate expression of Hope.

The resurrection of Jesus confirms that what Jesus did on the cross worked.

On the cross all our sin, our guilt, our shame was laid on Jesus.

He took upon himself the sin of the world.

That includes all my sin and your sin.

All my guilt and all your guilt.

All my shame and all your shame.

He took it all upon himself in our place.

Easter says the cross was effective.

It really did what it set out to do.

We really are free now to have relationship with Father God.

Free to approach him without any guilt or shame.

Free to love and serve Him.

I used to be a sceptic when it comes to Christianity.

Then over 30 years ago I experienced the risen Jesus.

It transformed my life.

Millions of people since that first Easter Day will also say they have experienced the risen Jesus.

People from all walks of life.

People from all nations and tribe groups, the rich, the poor, the educated, the uneducated...

The resurrection of Jesus isn't just a fanciful idea or cleverly crafted myth.

It is based on good historical evidence.

Evidence that we can examine.

Easter means our present life can be transformed.

Because Jesus is alive!

Sadness can turn to joy,

Fear can be turned to peace.

Hate can be turned to love.

Despair can be turned to Hope.

There is a great painting, done by Holman Hunt called the Light of the world.

It shows Jesus standing outside a door knocking.

The scene is of an over grown garden.

The scene depicts someone's life with Jesus knocking on the door, waiting to be invited in.

He's saying, Here I am, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone opens the door I will come in and eat with them and they with me.

In other words Jesus is saying I want to come and be part of your life.

In the painting there is no handle on the outside of the door.

Someone pointed that out to Hunt saying it must be a mistake.

But he replied and said, No, it was no mistake.

The only handle is on the inside.

Jesus doesn't force himself into anyone's life.

He loves us so much that he respects our free will.

He leaves us free to decide or not to open the door to him.

Maybe you have never invited Jesus into your life.

Maybe you used to know Him but your faith has grown cold over the years..

But you want to come back home...

Well, The Father longs for you to come back home..

If you would like to, then on this Easter Sunday take the opportunity to invite Jesus to come into your life.

If you want to do that, then here is a prayer you can use:

Just say, Lord Jesus Christ.. I am sorry for the things I have done wrong in my life

(take a few moments to ask his forgiveness for anything that is on your conscious).

Please forgive me. I now turn from everything which I know is wrong.

Thank you that you died on the cross for me so that I could be forgiven and set free.

Thank you that you offer me forgiveness, eternal life and the gift of Your Spirit. I now receive your Holy Spirit.

Please come into my life by Your Holy Spirit to be with me forever.

Thank you, Lord Jesus. Amen.
